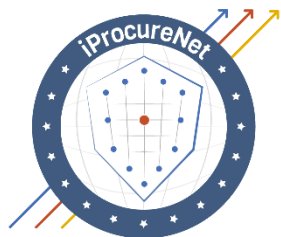

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PREVENT PCP

Objective: To develop video analytics solutions for the **detection of unattended items and tracking of the owners**, testing and validating them in real conditions in France, Spain, Italy and Portugal

Duration: 36 months from Sep 2021 to Aug 2024

Overall budget: €13.3 million, 90% financed by the EC

Consortium: 21 partners - 8 countries

Role: Work package leader, Task leader, End user



SHIELD4CROWD (CSA)

Objective: SHIELD4CROWD connects security practitioners across Europe to identify the common vulnerabilities posing risks to **the protection of public spaces and crowd management**.

Duration: 12 months from Aug 2024 to Jul 2024

Overall budget: €1 million, 100% financed by the EC

Consortium: 10 partners - 6 countries

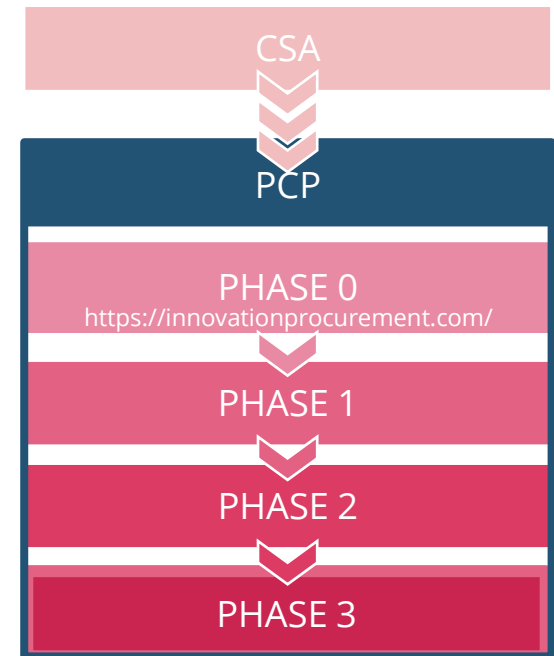
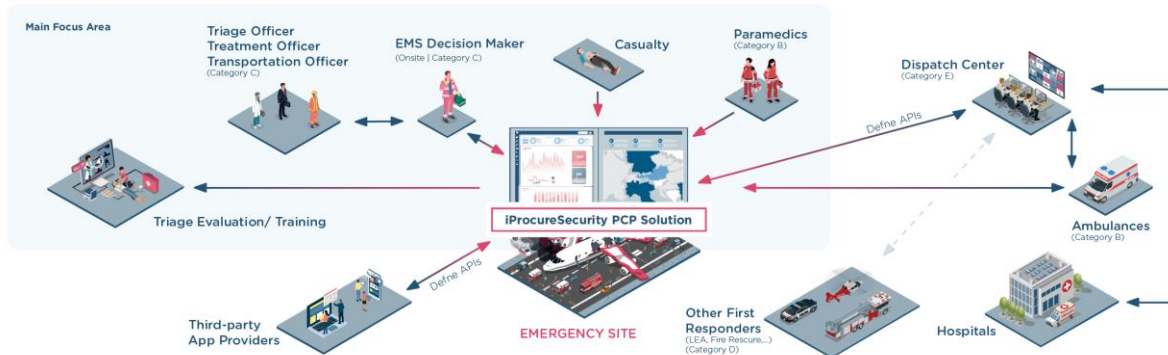

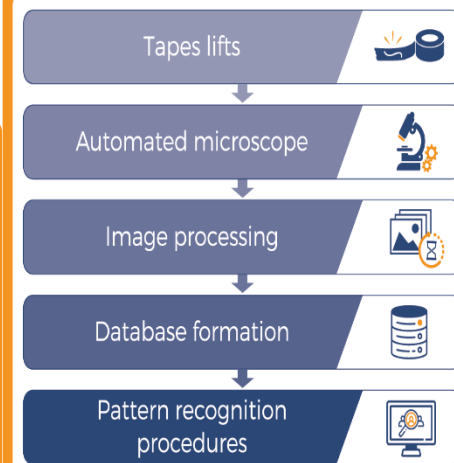

Schedule

An H2020 pre-commercial procurement (PCP) project
 Total budget: €10.5m
 EU funding: 90 %
 Phase 0 - Start May 2018 - Preparation of specifications and call for tenders
 Phase 1 - February 2020 until August 2020 – 3 suppliers selected - Detailed design of solutions
 Phase 2 - September 2020 to July 2021- Prototype development
 Phase 3 - August 2021 until July 2022 - 2 suppliers selected - Operational validation - Prototypes tested in laboratory

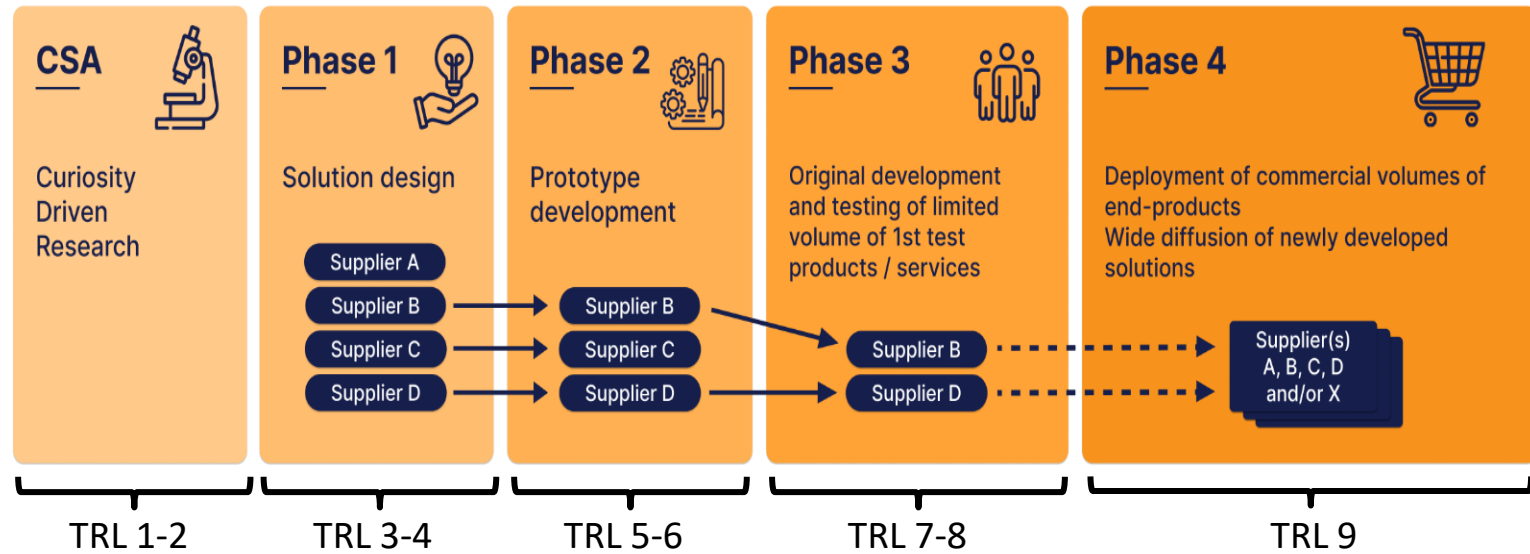

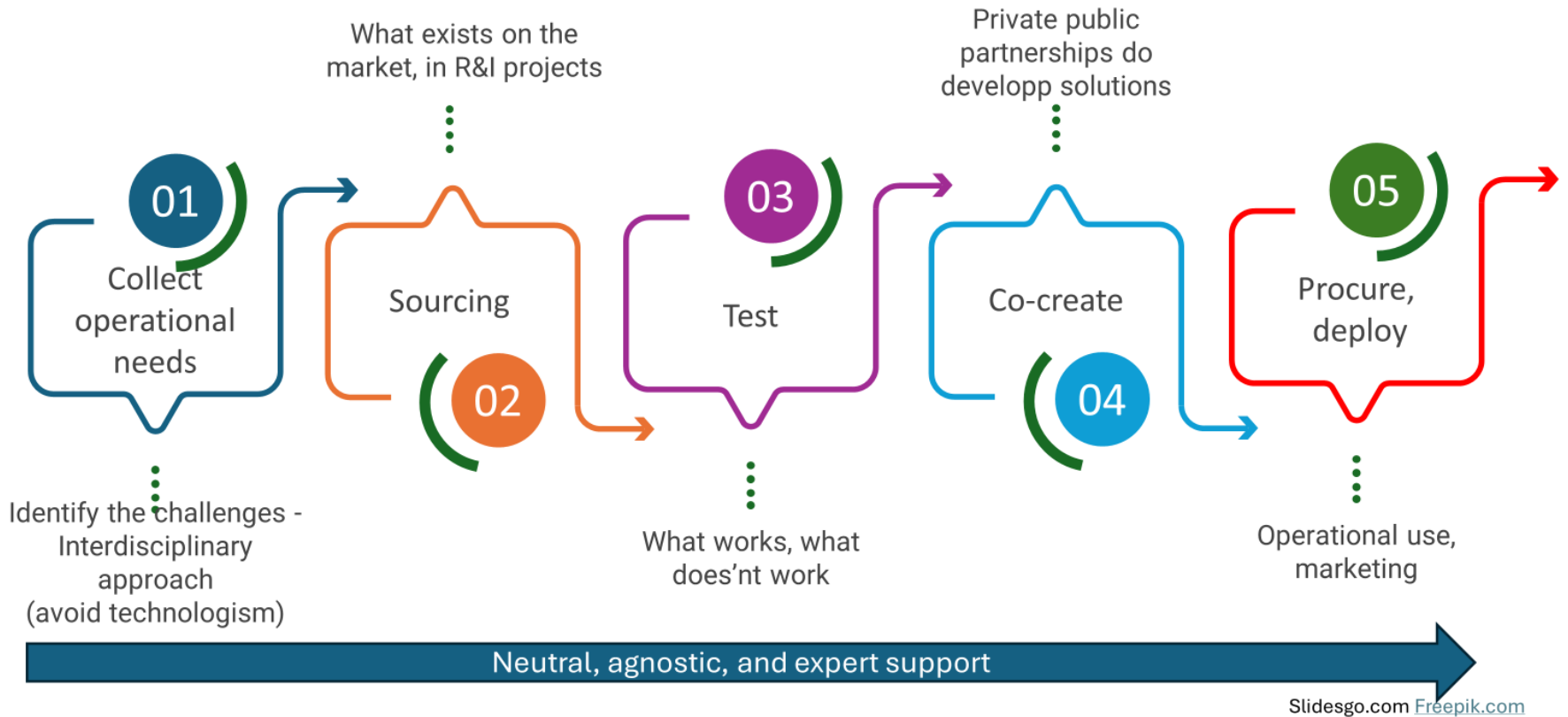

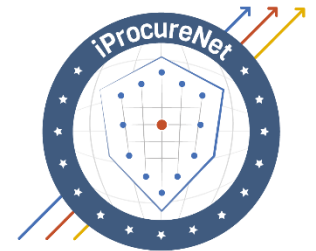
